THIS SUNDAY, JUNE 16, 2024 Fourth Sunday after Pentecost

This Sunday we gather around Word and Table to rejoice in God's life-giving presence as we hear Jesus tell the parable of the mustard seed, "the smallest of all seeds," that becomes something far greater than we can ever imagine.

Consider this:

The mustard seed becomes a great shrub that shelters the birds, recalling ancient images of the tree of life. We'd expect a cedar or a sequoia, but Jesus finds the power of God better imaged in a tiny, no-account seed. It's not the way we expect divine activity to look. Yet the tree of life is here, in the cross around which we gather, the tree into which we are grafted through baptism, the true vine that nourishes us with its fruit in the cup we share. It may not appear all that impressive, but while nobody's looking it grows with a power beyond our understanding.

Emanuel Nine, martyrs, 2015

On June 17, 2015, Clementa C. Pinckney, Cynthia Marie Graham Hurd, Susie Jackson, Ethel Lee Lance, DePayne Middleton-Doctor, Tywanza Sanders, Daniel Lee Simmons, Sharonda Coleman-Singleton, and Myra Thompson were murdered by a self-professed white supremacist while they were gathered for Bible study and prayer at the Emanuel African Methodist Episcopal Church (often referred to as Mother Emanuel) in Charleston, South Carolina. Pastors Pinckney and Simmons were both graduates of the Lutheran Theological Southern Seminary. A resolution to commemorate June 17 as a day of repentance for the martyrdom of the Emanuel Nine was adopted by the Churchwide Assembly of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America on August 8, 2019.

We give you thanks, Holy God, for the faithful life and witness of Clementa, Cynthia, Daniel, DePayne, Ethel, Myra, Sharonda, Susie, and Tywanza, the Emanuel Nine. May their faith and witness to your forgiving love in Jesus Christ inspire all people to pursue paths of justice, courage, and self-giving love. **Amen**

Our three congregations will gather to worship together at St. Andrew Church. The Rev. Steven Wilco, Associate to the Bishop of the New England Synod, who has been walking with us from the beginning of our discussions and development of the new church, will be our preacher.

Immediately following worship will we turn our attention to the naming of the new church. What will our name say to the community around us about who we are and what we are about? Will it be an inviting name that others are drawn to? The five names currently being considered are: Hope Lutheran Church, New Hope Lutheran Church, Living Hope Lutheran Church, Faith Lutheran Church, United in Faith Lutheran Church.

A special Coffee Hour and Ice Cream Social Hour will follow in the Hall. (Yes, ice cream before lunch! Yea!)

July 16...What Will Change for Us in a New Church?

We will welcome the Rev. Maria Hammons, Associate to the Bishop of the New England Synod, whose role is to help congregations walk gracefully through change, closure and new days. She will preach during worship and the lead us in discussion during coffee hour about the challenges, opportunities, and responsibilities that lie ahead for us as three congregations become one.

NEW BISHOP ELECTED AT SYNOD ASSEMBLY

The Rev. Nathan Pipho was elected on the fifth and final ballot to serve as the new Bishop of the New England Synod at the Synod's annual Assembly that ran from June 6-8. He currently serves as pastor of Trinity Lutheran Church in Worcester, MA, and will begin his new role as Bishop on August 1.

Those in attendance also celebrated the ministry of the Rev. Jim Hazelwood who has served as Bishop for the last 12 years. (Bishops in the ELCA are elected to six-year terms.). Bishop Hazelwood presided over the sessions of the Assembly in which elections for a variety of positions were held, a budget was passed, and updates were heard from various synodical and national church ministries. The Assembly, held at the DCU Center in Worcester, was attended by over 500 delegates, visitors and special guests.

Our thanks to those who ably represented St. Andrew Church at the Assembly: Connor Pratt, Britt Lynch, and Arlene Creswell. Pastor Swenson also attended, as well as Kristen Pratt and Bob Herold who attended as visitors.

You are encouraged to embrace our Bishop-elect in your prayers as he prepared to assume his new call to serve the church.
