SUNDAY, JUNE 30, WILL BE NAMING DAY!

Members and friends from Grace, Plainfield and Zion and St. Andrew, Bristol, will join together for worship at St. Andrew Church on Sunday, June 30, 9:30 as we continue to lean in expectation toward the beginning of a new ministry — three congregations becoming one. The Rev. Steven Wilco, Associate to the Bishop of the New England Synod, who has helped guide the process of this consolidation over the past year, will be the preacher.

Immediately following worship will we turn our attention to the naming of the new church. What will our name say to the community around us about who we are and what we are about? Will it be an inviting name that others are drawn to? The five names currently being considered are: Hope Lutheran Church, New Hope Lutheran Church, Living Hope Lutheran Church, Faith Lutheran Church, United in Faith Lutheran Church. Having a name for the new congregation will bring the reality of the new day ever closer.

A special Coffee Hour and Ice Cream Social Hour will follow in the Hall. (Did someone say ice cream before lunch?! Yes!!) Plus during the Social Hour there will be outdoor activities (like Corn Hole) for kids and adults who like to play with kids.

Notes from New Church Steering Committee, June 12

The Steering Committee, comprised of members from each of the three congregations committed to the formation of a new ministry, continues its diligent work on the details of consolidation. Highlights of the Committee's most recent meeting held June 12, at Grace Church, Plainville, included:

- Discussion of election of officers for the Steering Committee. They will be elected at the next Committee meeting.
- Continued work on the optional sections of the Model Constitution for ELCA congregations. Bylaws will include an outline for the relationship of Meals for Neighbors housed at the current Zion Church building and the new congregation. A special Board, accountable to the Steering Committee, is being appointed to oversee this important ministry to the community.

- Reviewed plans for the joint worship service and new church naming event on June 30.
- Heard reports from various committees as they begin work on shaping various dimensions of the new ministry. Committees include: Property (working especially on making the current Stafford Ave. property a home for everyone); Worship and Music; Faith Formation for children, youth and adults; Community Outreach; Parish Life; Reconciling in Christ process; Finance; Stewardship; and Evangelism. Brief descriptions of the Committees will be shared on June 30 along with opportunities for folks to express their willingness to help develop these ministries.
- Heard that Call Committee is in process of writing the important Ministry Site Profile describing the projected aims and goals of the new congregation to be used in search for candidates to serve as the new pastor of "Soon to be Named Lutheran Church."
- Affirmed that the meetings of the Committee are open to members of the current three congregations to attend with voice but no vote regarding decisions and directions being made.

The next meeting of the Steering Committee will be Tuesday, June 25, 6:30, at 1125 Stafford Ave.
