FAITH LUTHERAN CHURCH STEERING COMMITTEE CONTINUES WORK IN SHAPING NEW MINISTRY

At its meeting on Tuesday, August 13, the Steering Committee continued to blaze the path to the formation of the new Faith Lutheran Church — three congregations (Grace, Zion and St. Andrew) becoming one, aiming for our first official worship service on Reformation Sunday, October 27.

Among the highlights of the meeting during which numerous issues were discussed:

- Heard that legal documents were now being prepared for the formal closure of the three congregations and for the incorporation of the new ministry by Attorney Bradford Cook of Manchester, NH.
- Both the Grace Church building and property and the triplex building owned by Zion Church are on the real estate market.
- The writing of the Constitution for new congregation is now complete.
- The Safe Church policy is nearing completion.
- A small committee is preparing the way for the hiring of an Administrative Assistant for the new congregation. The position was posted on Indeed, the online job search site, on August 15. The goal is for this staff person to begin in mid-October.
- The Property Committee, chaired by Bill Golden, has been busy preparing the current St. Andrew building to become the home for the new Faith Church. They met with an architect on August 14 to discuss possibilities for the redesign of the altar/chancel area of the church.
- The Worship Committee, chaired by Karen Biernat, is now planning for the first worship of the new congregation on October 27 and for the first weeks of our life together.
- Heard that Gwynne Hopko has accepted the invitation to serve as the Interim Minister of Music for Faith Church. (All appointed staff positions will be for six months with the possibility of renewal and continuation.)

- The Finance Committee is working on what computer programs the new church will be using for financial records. The Thomaston Savings Bank has been chosen as Faith Church's bank.
- The Call Committee, tasked with interviewing and recommending to the Steering Committee a candidate to serve as the pastor of Faith Church, has received the name of one candidate.
- We are seeking a person (or persons) to design a website and a logo for Faith Church.
- Hoping to begin a single weekly NewsNotes for the members and friends of our current congregations in September in order to keep everyone informed on church ministries and developments.
- A letter will soon be sent to all current members of the three congregations to update their address/contact information and to ensure they will want to continue their faith journeys as participants in the life of Faith Church.
- The Evangelism, Stewardship and Faith Formation ministries are in early stages of development.

Bob Herold, Bill Golden and Karen Biernat, elected representatives from St. Andrew Church to the Steering Committee, are always eager to respond to your questions and share updated news with you about the process of becoming a new congregation.

The next meeting of the Steering Committee will be Monday, August 26, 6:30 p.m., at St. Andrew.
