SPECIAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING CALLED FOR SEPTEMBER 29... FORMAL STEPS TOWARD FORMATION OF FAITH CURCH

A special Congregational Meeting for the members of St. Andrew Lutheran Church has been called by the Congregation Council for Sunday, September 29, following worship. This meeting marks the final steps toward becoming a part of an exciting new venture in ministry!

The meeting's key purpose is to vote on a series of documents regarding the legal closure of St. Andrew Church and the legal incorporation of the new Faith Lutheran Church. Approval of the Constitution of the new congregation will also be voted on. A fourth matter will be to approve the proposed distribution of our Legacy Gifts. The Congregation Council, after careful conversation at its August 25 meeting, has proposed \$2,500 gifts to the Camp Calumet Lutheran Campership Fund, the ELCA Fund for Leaders (supporting students preparing for the ordained ministry), Agape House, Bristol, and St. Vincent DePaul Center, Bristol.

Copies of the legal documents for the church closure and new church incorporation, as well as the Constitution for Faith Church, have now been emailed to all voting members of the congregation. Due to the large amount of paper involved, a very limited amount of hard copies are available in the church office. Call if you would like to stop by and pick up copies or you need someone to drop the copies off to your house.

All three congregations in the new partnership — Zion, Grace and St. Andrew — will be voting on these

This is the story of how the St Andrew Handbells spent the summer. After 25 years of continuous use, the 66 tired bells were transported back to the Malmark Factory in Bucks County, PA (courtesy of Bob and Vera Herold) to be refurbished.

To refurbish the handbells means: to completely disassemble and inspect the handbells. While apart, the technicians at the Malmark factory clean, adjust and replace handles, springs and clapper heads where necessary. Bells are polished twice, first by machine inside and out and for the last time, by hand. The members of the bell choir are thrilled that their bells are now sounding just as beautiful as they look! Just as they did when new 25 years ago.
