CONGREGATIONAL MEETING AFFIRMS FINAL STEPS TOWARD BIRTH OF A NEW CONGREGATION ON OCTOBER 27!

At a specially called Congregational Meeting after worship on Sunday, September 29, participating members voted unanimously in favor of a series of five resolutions that will lead to the formal closure of St. Andrew Lutheran Church as a congregation and open the way to the formation of the new Faith Lutheran Church of Bristol, the joining together of the ministries of the present St. Andrew, Grace and Zion Lutheran Churches.

The first worship service of Faith Lutheran Church will be held on Reformation Sunday, October 27, at 9:30 a.m. It will be a celebration of new life and promise after a year and a half of prayerful discernment and planning and hard work by the people of the three congregations who shared the common goal of building a new ministry for a new day.

The Rev. Steven Wilco, Assistant to the Bishop of the New England Synod, who has helped guide the formation of this new congregation since the early days of our joint conversations, will be the preacher for the October 27 celebration.

Copies of the resolutions voted on at the meeting were made available to all voting members of the congregation in mid-September mailings. Hard copies of the resolutions and of the new constitution of Faith Lutheran Church (approved in one of the resolutions) are available from the church office upon request.

The people of Zion and Grace Churches also voted unanimously in support of closure and formation resolutions on September 29. We are on the way!
